#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

A discussion was had on the process for updates and revisions for Accelerated Bachelors/Masters Programs. Of specific interest was the hour and GPA limitations for such programs. After some discussion, it was agreed that the currently stated requirements were academically appropriate and acceptable limitations.

Policy on Concurrent Master's Degrees

A new Policy on Concurrent Master's degrees (shown below) was discussed and approved. Questions regarding the differences between concurrent programs and a traditional second degree. Clarification on this distinction was provided. The policy was approved without opposition.

## **Concurrent Master's Degrees**

Auburn University also offers a number of approved concurrent master's degree programs, which are specially designed to offer outstanding Auburn graduate students the opportunity to earn two master's degrees in less time and cost than usual by allowing students to double count or share more credit hours than allowed for a second master's degree. A list of approved concurrent master's degrees can be found on the Graduate School website. Such programs require students to be enrolled concurrently in both degrees. They may share up to 9 credit hours if the total hours for both degrees sum to 65 or less. Or they may share up to 12 credit hours if the total hours for both degrees sum to 66 or more. Approval for concurrent programs requires proposal submission by the

offering academic unit(s) and review and approval by the Graduate Council Curriculum Committee and the Graduate Council.

Academic Bankruptcy policy

A new Academic Bankruptcy Policy (shown below) was discussed and approved. Concern was expressed that the readmission only be allowed with the approval of the department. This requirement was affirmed in the policy. The policy was approved without opposition.

## **Academic Bankruptcy Policy**

Auburn University graduate students who have been suspended or expelled because of poor academic performance may petition the Graduate School for a declaration of academic bankruptcy. Academic bankruptcy allows the student to petition their program, department, and the Graduate School to restart their graduate program after a minimum of a one calendar year separation from Auburn University. For readmission, the student must submit a readmission request form and must be recommended for readmission by the graduate program to which the student is applying. If the graduate program recommends readmission, the student must, in coordination with the Graduate School and program Graduate Program Officer (GPO), identify the semester(s) for which they request academic bankruptcy. If approved, the student forfeits all graduate courses and credits earned at Auburn University for those semesters. Auburn University will retain all forfeited courses on the student's transcript but will not include forfeited courses in the calculation of the Graduate Grade Point Average. Students may not declare academic bankruptcy more than once.
